Nepal foundation comes to Auburn

The PadmaDal Memorial Foundation has moved from Nepal to Auburn and recently organized a blood drive at Wal-Mart Supercenter in Auburn.

The organization was founded in Nepal in 1997 by Dr. Lila B. Karki. He came to the U.S. in 2005 when his wife started a doctoral program at Auburn University.

“I accompanied her and helped to take care of our two school-going children most of the time,” he said. “In addition to our jobs with the government in Nepal, we used to run an academy/foundation in Nepal to help those who help themselves in the rural communities.”

Last year, Karki and some of his associates re-

ceived 501(c)3 tax-exempt status from the IRS to operate a similar foundation in this country.

Karki said the blood drive for LIFEsouth Community Blood Center was a success.

“The motto ‘Donate for the Community’ and the relentless effort of the organizers, volunteers and wellwishers really attracted people,” he said. “A single pint of blood can help save up to three lives. United we stand and divided we fall.”
